## **Summary**

Despite increasing scientific and policy attention to the role of urban networks in regional market integration, there has been limited evidence substantiating these claims. The dissertation is motivated by this observed paradox - exploring the link between urban networks and market integration within China's megacity-regions, focusing on three key themes: (1) the varied effects of urban networks on regional market integration; (2) the underlying mechanisms, explored through network externalities and regional synergies; and (3) the additional roles of cities' spatial attributes in shaping the dynamics of network-integration relations. Employing a combination of (spatial) economic modeling techniques, this dissertation delivers robust evidence on the role of urban networks in explaining China's integration dynamics. Key findings reveal that urban networks exert varied effects on market integration, especially through the presence of network externalities and synergy effects. These effects are influenced by the heterogeneous types of networks and markets and are conditionally shaped by cities' spatial attributes. This research contributes to both scientific discourse and policy debates on the implications of urban networks in market integration and regional development dynamics.
